1. GENERAL INFORMATION

Enquiries on the day to the Contest Supervisors. Prior to that via vic@pipebandsaustralia.com.au

Bus parking will be available on Park Road outside Princes Park. Designated band parking areas and venue information and maps will be forwarded to band secretaries ahead of the Championships.

Band entry to Princes Park will be available from 7.00am on 13th April.

(Bands may also set up tents on 12th April if preferred)

Band representatives must report to the PBV Office between 8.30am and 1.00pm on 13th April, before the band competes to:

- a) sign in (a band not signed in may be treated as withdrawn from the contest);
- b) collect any late changes to the Draw, noting that any band withdrawals may result in contest timings being advanced;
- c) confirm any advice previously provided to the Branch Office;
- d) comply with the requirements of the Rules in respect of A.3.03.04 (d) for interchange players, A.3.07 for Dual Registered players and, if applicable, B.1.02.03 and B.1.04.03 between the MSR and / or SOM. The approved forms on the APBA website must be used.
- e) to confirm the designated fine tuning and re-tuning areas.

All bands are invited to attend the Opening Ceremony at 12.45 -13.00

2. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Bands must be registered with Pipe Bands Australia or a reciprocal organisation. Participation in the Massed Band is a requirement of all bands. Non-participation in Massed Band may result in disqualification.

3. BAND INFORMATION

FINE TUNING

This is a two circle contest. There will be 3 fine tuning areas for each of Circle A and Circle B (map).

START TIME

Bands must be at the relevant starting point(s) for contest elements (flags AA, see below), ready to compete at the nominated times. It is the responsibility of bands to be on time at the starting point. Penalties apply to bands who are late, as per Rule B.1.06.

The Draw allows a re-tune time between elements in accord with Rule B.1.01.04.

ALTERATION & AMENDMENT TO THE DRAW

Any request for a variation to the Draw must be made in accordance with Rule B.1.05.04, immediately the relevant circumstances have arisen.

COMPETITION ELEMENTS


Dress Inspection: The judging of the Dress element will take place during the Medley element.

Drill and Dress element will be adjudicated during the Street Parade, for those participating. There will be no additional Drill element or March Off assessment conducted at APBC2024.

4. Australian Drum Major Championships: PBA Regulations effective 11th April 2024.

Dress Inspection

Competitors are required to assemble at the PBV Office sign, near Princes Park stand at 15.45.

Marching, Deportment and Flourish elements

Competitors are required to the attend Drum Major Championship course at 16.25, Circle A.

Duty Band

Coastal Scottish Pipe Band WA, to attend Circle A at 16.20.

Music

6/8 Marches

PBA Contest Regulations apply:

D.4.01.02 A player shall wear approved band uniform or Highland or other dress to the satisfaction of the Association, and carry a mace which, when the ferrule is in contact with the ground, reaches at least to the top of the player's shoulder when standing at attention, or which is 1.35m in length, whichever length is the lesser.

D.4.01.02 When a final is conducted, there shall not be a further Dress Inspection, but each player shall be awarded the same number of points for Dress as in his original Dress Inspection.

D.4.01.05 (a) No less than two Dress and Drill judges will be rostered for the Australian Drum Major Championships.

PROCEDURE (D.4.03 refers)

D.4.03.01 The players will report at the time prescribed by the Contest Supervisor, for Dress Inspection, which will be carried out at a convenient location.

D. 4.03.02 When directed by the Judge or official, the players will move to the start line, halt and stand at ease.

D.4.03.03 Judging (other than for Dress) will commence when the Judge directs the players to come to attention: they will then do so.

D.4.03.04 (a) The judge will ensure that the duty band is ready, and on the judge's order the band will commence playing (in 6/8 time at a tempo of approximately 96 beats per minute) and the players will commence marching.

(b) Competitors in the Adult event will complete 4.5 lengths of the course, finishing in line with the second flag in the centre of the course where they will mark time until the end of the part of music being played, then halt and give a mace signal to the band to cease playing, at the end of that part.

D.4.03.05 On approaching each turn point, a player will give a mace signal to signify the approaching turn, and, at the point, turnabout.

D.4.03.06 On approaching the halt point, a player will give a mace signal in preparation to halting, mark time in line with the flag until the end of the part of the music then being played, halt, and give a "Cease playing" signal during the next double forte part.

D.4.03.07 When all players have completed this procedure the Judge will direct the duty band to cease playing, and the players to stand at ease, which they will do, whereupon judging will cease. The players will stand fast until dismissed by the Judge.

5. Girl on a Drum at 16.55

The promoter, the Maryborough Highland Society, will coordinate this event. It will take place directly in front of the Princes Park Stand.

6. Massed Band at 17.05.

Drum Major in Charge for Massed Band is Sgt Benjamin Casey, 5th /6th Bttn, Royal Victoria Regiment Pipes and Drums.

All bands to assemble, in a timely manner, and not in grades, at the designated area on the arena from 16.40, to be ready for the Massed band performance at 17.10.

Drum / Pipe Majors ensure spacing between files is at least two paces.

Music: Advance Bonnie Dundee and A Hundred Pipers

Retire (static): "Scotland the Brave" and" Badge of Scotland.

7. Results and presentation of trophies, banners, and sashes at 17.15

On the command of the Drum Major in charge, bands will be dismissed allowing all band members to move to the front of Princes Park Pavilion for the results and presentations at 17.20.

Leaders (DMs PMs, and DSs) of winning bands are to be ready to come forward, on invitation, when results and presentations are announced.

The results for the **Street Parade** are announced first, by grade, commencing with Grade 4B. There is a single first place for each grade. Band representatives (DMs, PMs and DSs) are invited to come forward to receive a 1st place trophy in Grade 4B, Grade 4A and Grade 3.

The results for the **Australian Drum Major Championships** are announced: **3**rd, **2**nd **and 1**st, in that order. DM competitors are invited to come forward to receive trophies.

The results of the **Australian Pipe Band Championships** are announced by grade, commencing with Juvenile Novice B: **3**rd, **2**nd **and 1**st in that order. Band representatives (DMs PMs and DSs) are invited to come forward to receive a trophy in all grades.

A Banner and a Sash are awarded to the winning band (1st place on aggregate) and the best drum corps in each grade, respectively.

Prize monies

Following the results and prizes presentation, bands placing 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each grade of the Australian Pipe Band Championships and Drum Major competitors are asked to report to the PBV Office to provide relevant bank account details for electronic funds transfer of prize monies.




9. Venue Information

Street Parade assembly and march route

Bands to assemble at the corner of Nolan and High Streets. The Parade will be down High Street, finishing at Entry 2 to Princes Park.

10. Public hospitality areas

There are two hospitality marquees on the arena, for band members and the public.

There is a youth (under 18 year old) marquee where younger band members may socialise, serving soft drinks and snacks for purchase. This is an alcohol-free zone. There is no alcohol to be purchased in this area and alcohol cannot be brought into the area.

There is an adult marquee with a bar selling beers, wines, spirits, and snacks. Patrons must be over 18 years old to enter. Proof-of-age may be requested.

Both marquees are staffed by the Maryborough Highland Society, each with additional security marshals.

11. Gate passes (wristbands)

Registered players with all entered bands, Drum Major competitors, adjudicators, officials, PBV Life Members, and VIP guests of PBA and PBV will receive wristbands to allow free entry to the venue.
